MINUTES.

Letters from the several churches were then read, from which the annexed table was prepared.

- o. Ordered that our Abstract of Principles be printed in these minutes.
 - 10. Secretary reported work all up.
- minutes of 1885, be and is so amended that nothing therein shall be so construed as to either exclude or debar the innocent party from membership in the church, and the church alone is the judge of the fitness of the one applying for membership.
- 12. Obituary of Elders H. Davis and M. Slone be printed in these minutes.
- 13. W. J. May is appointed to superintend the printing of the minutes—800 in number, and distribute the same among the churches, and he is allowed out of the contribution \$10.00 for his services as Clerk and Treasurer.
- 14. Our next Association is appointed with the Little Hope church, Pinsonfork, Pike Co., Ky., Friday before the First Sabbath in Sept., 1908., and Eld. J. B. Weddington preach the introductory sermon, and J. D. Riffe be, and is, his alternate. Pinsonfork is 10 miles South-east of Matewon and Williamson on the N. W. R. R.

Then adjouned till the time and place of our next Association.

Eld. Henry Davis was born May 15, 1843, and died July 13, 1906; making his stay on earth 63 years, 1 month, and 28 days. Bro. Davis joined the United Baptist organization, and

ABSTRACT OF PRINCIPLES.

We believe in one true and living God, who is the Creator, Upholder and Righteous Disposer of all things, and that he is self-existent, independent, omnipotent and eternal.

- 8. We believe there will be a resurrection of the bodies, both of the just and the unjust; and that the happiness of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal.
- 9. We believe that baptism and the Lord's supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only subjects, and the true mode of baptism is immersion.
