CIRCULAR LETTER

Dear Brethren:

Having been chosen to write to you in the form of a circular letter, this one hundred fifty eighth annual session of the Mates Creek District Regular Primitive Baptist Association, I will fulfill this request, if the Lord will bless me. For the last year, my thoughts about this letter have been on our great King and his Kingdom.

There are many scriptures that let us know who the King of the Kingdom is. In Isaiah 9:6 we read, "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, The mighty God, The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. (9:7) Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his Kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even forever. Then in Matthew 21:5 we read, "Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the

foal of an ass."

In Luke 1:31-33, the Angel Gabriel spoke to Mary about the birth of Jesus. He told her, "And, behold, thou shall conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David: And he shall reign over the house of Jacob forever; and of his Kingdom there shall be no end." Yes brethren, when Jesus was born into this world, he was already the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords.

Now, if God would bless us we will speak of the King's Kingdom. There have been many kings and kingdoms of this world which have fallen, but God's Kingdom is everlasting; to it there shall be no end.

In John 3:3, we read that Jesus said, "Verily, Verily I say unto thee

except a man be born again he cannot see the kingdom."

In Matthew 18:1 The Disciples asked, "Who is the greatest in the Kingdom of heaven." (18:2) "Jesus called a little child unto him, and set him in the midst of them, (18:3) and said, verily I say unto you, except ye be converted, and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the Kingdom of heaven. (18:4) Whosoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, the same is greatest in the Kingdom of heaven. (18:5) And whoso shall receive one such little child in my name receiveth me." Also, we are instructed to seek the Kingdom of God and his righteousness.

As Jesus lived upon this Earth and began to preach, he preached for the people to "Repent: for the kingdom of heaven was at hand." But not just any people, the chosen people that are spoken of in Matthew 4:16. God". He clearly told them there will be some living at that time.



He is survived by his present wife of 29 years, Melster Yates Owens Brown of Vansant, Virginia. Four children from his marriage to his first wife, Draper Irene Hess Brown, survive; Roger Dale Brown of Lorton, Virginia; Donna Faye Brown Coleman and husband Denny of Richlands, Virginia; Ola Gaye Brown Clevinger and husband Danny of Oakwood, Virginia; and Kenneth Elmer Brown and wife Valarie of Bristol, Tennessee. He is survived by five grandchildren: Andrea Lynn Coleman Clark and husband Jeffery Dale of Salem, Virginia; Roger Dale Brown, Jr. of Dumfries, Virginia; Carrie Beth Clevinger of Washington, Pennsylvania; Vanessa Irene Clevinger of Honaker, Virginia and Corey Levi Brown of Knoxville, Tennessee. He is survived by two great-grandchildren, Jenna Danielle Clark and Allison Layne Clark both of Salem, Virginia.

Also surviving is one sister, Francis Lucille Brown Pendell of Bristol, Virginia; four brothers, Carl Berkley Brown and Ann of Colonial Beach, Virginia; Emory Ferrill Brown and Ruth of Spotsylvania, Virginia; Henry Earl Brown and Mildred of Bristol, Virginia and Richard Nelson Brown and Nancy of Bluff City, Tennessee; one sister-in-law, Doris Whited Brown of Rosedale, Virginia. Dad joined the Primitive Baptist Church and was baptized in January 1965 having his membership at the Dry Fork Primitive Baptist Church at Vansant, Virginia. He was ordained as an Elder in December 1967. He served as an Assistant Moderator for the Dry Fork Primitive Baptist Church from October 1974 through December 1991. He served as the Moderator for the Dry Fork Primitive Baptist Church from December 1991 until he requested to be replaced, due to health problems, in December 2004. He was an Honorary Moderator there until his passing.

Elder Brown, as a lot of people referred to him, served as Joint Moderator at the Sulphur Springs Primitive Baptist Church at Hurley, Virginia from April 1969 until February 1990. He served as the Moderator of the Sulphur Springs Primitive Baptist Church from February 1990 until he requested to be replaced, due to health problems, in January 2005. He was an Honorary Moderator there until his passing.

Dad served as an Assistant Moderator at the Lick Creek Primitive Baptist Church at Lick Creek, Virginia from March 1981 and was considered as an Assistant Moderator until his passing.

Dad loved visiting and preaching at the churches in the Associations. He respected all churches and denominations. He was a dedicated servant to the people and a man of great faith. He traveled many miles in Virginia, Kentucky, Ohio, Tennessee, West Virginia and Michigan spreading the word of God. He preached numerous funerals and performed many wedding ceremonies and many baptisms.

Dad entered the U.S. Army in November 1942 serving in World War II. He was a Combat Infantryman and was recipient of a Purple Heart along with many other medals and ribbons. He received his Honorable Discharge in December 1945. He was a member of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars. Dad was a patriotic citizen who flew the Flag proudly. He always prayed for our soldiers. He was laid to rest with full military honors.

Dad was a retired coal miner. He worked 33 1/2 years in the coal mines in Buchanan County, Virginia. He retired from Beatrice Pocahontas Coal Company in July 1976. He was a member of the Untied Mine Workers of America. Dad was a productive man who worked hard to provide a living for his family rarely ever complaining about his job.

He was an avid outdoorsman. He loved gardening, fishing and hunting. As his health declined, he still enjoyed being outside. He liked sitting on the porch watching the birds and visit-

ing with family and friends.

His sweet smile would remind all of us how much he enjoved life and how much he loved each of us—family, friend or stranger. He had two families he loved dearly —the family he had with our beloved mother and the family he shared with his

second wife, Melster.

So, Dad, "Just One Rose Will Do" for your time came for leaving. You have bid us all adieu. You have gone to a beautiful garden, for your life's work is through. You were an old fashioned preacher who preached a sermon so true. You sang old time songs and enjoyed them, too. You will need no organization or bright decorations where you have gone to. That garden

is so beautiful from your Heavenly view.

Dad, we think of you with love today. We speak your name with respect. We re-live our memories-memories of times gone by. Your memory is our keepsake with which we will never part. 
ELLIS SLONE







CONSTITUTION

- 1. This Association shall be called the Original Mates Creek District Primitive Baptist Association.
- 2. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the different churches in our union, and duly sent to represent them in the Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for that purpose, and producing letters from their respective churches certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats.
- 3. In the letters from the different churches shall be expressed their membership in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, dismissed by letter, excluded and deceased since the last Association.
- 4. The members thus chosen and convened shall have no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor shall they have any clerical powers over the churches, nor shall they infringe on any of the internal rights of any church in this union.
- 5. The Association when convened, shall be governed by a regular and proper Decorum.
- 6. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk, who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the messengers present, and that by secret ballot.
- 7. Newly constituted churches may be admitted into the union who shall petition by letter and messenger, and (if found upon examination to be orthodox and orderly), shall be received by the Association, and manifested by the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.

- 8. Every church in the union shall be entitled to a representation in the Association.
- 9. Every query presented by any church to the Association, being first debated in their own church, shall be taken up by the Association.
- 10. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except it shall be withdrawn by the member who made it.
- 11. The Association shall endeavor to furnish the churches with Minutes of the Association, the best way and method for effecting that purpose shall be at the discretion of future Associations.
- 12. We think it absolutely necessary that we have an Association fund for defraying the expenses of the same, for the raising and supporting of which we think it the duty of each church in the union to contribute such sums voluntarily as they think proper, and send it by the hands of their messengers to the Association, and those monies thus contributed by the churches and received by the Association shall be deposited in the hands of the Treasurer, who shall be accountable to the Association for all monies received by him, and pay out of the same according to the Association.
- 13. There shall be an Association book kept, wherein the proceedings of every Association shall be regularly recorded by the Secretary chosen for that purpose, who shall receive compensation for his trouble.
- 14. The Minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association arises.
- 15. Amendments to this plan or form of government may be made at any time by majority of the union when they deem it necessary.

- 16. The Association shall have power: (1) To provide for the general union of the churches. (2) To preserve inviolably a chain of communication among the churches. (3) To give the churches necessary advice in matters of church difficulty. (4) To inquire into the cause why the churches fail to represent themselves at any time in the Association. (5) To appropriate those monies by the churches contributed for an Association fund to any purpose they may think proper. (6) To appoint any member or members by and with their consent to transact any business they may see necessary. (7) The Association shall have power to withdraw from any church in this union which shall violate the rules of this Association, or deviate from the orthodox principles of religion. (8) To admit any orderly minister of our faith and order to a seat in the Association. (9) The Association shall have power to adjourn themselves to any time or place they may think most convenient to the churches of the Association.
- 17. We welcome any and all orderly and peace-loving Primitive Baptist to visit with us.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe in one true living God, who is the Creator, upholder, and righteous disposer of all things; and that He is self-existent, independent, omnipotent and eternal.
- 2. We believe that Jesus existed in His mediatorial Person as the head and life of His body, the church from everlasting.
- 3. We believe in the doctrine of eternal, personal and unconditional election; that the elect, or church, is and was and shall forever remain His body and fullness, and their spiritual life is hid with Christ in God.

- 4. We believe in the doctrine of total depravity of human nature, and that recovery from that condition is wholly and exclusively by the sovereign, free and unmerited grace of God.
- We believe the atonement made by Christ was full and complete and exclusively for the elect, or heirs of promise.
- 6. We believe the doctrine of God's predestination in every sense as the Bible teaches it.
- 7. We believe that all the elect vessels of mercy, chosen in Christ before the foundation of the world, shall be called, regenerated and sanctified by the regenerating power of God's grace, and shall ultimately enjoy heaven and immortal glory.
- 8. We believe that there will be a resurrection of the bodies, both of the just and the unjust, and the happiness of the righteous shall be eternal, and the punishment of the wicked shall be everlasting.
- 9. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the subjects, and the true mode of baptism is immersion, foot washing as an example.
- 10. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as translated under the reign of King James, are a revelation from God, inspired by the Holy Ghost, and that the New Testament is the standard of faith and the only authorized rule of practice to the church of God under gospel dispensation. We therefore consider ourselves solemnly bound by our allegiance to the King of Zion to reject, disclaim and disfellowship all modern and ancient religious institutions or societies of which we have neither precept nor example in the New Testament.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator,
 Clerk and Assistant Clerk, who shall be chosen by the suffrage of
 the messengers present, and that by secret ballot.
- 3. Only one member shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to speak.
- 4. The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted by any except the Moderator until he is done speaking.
- 5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject, and in no wise reflect on the person who spoke before so as to make remarks on his slips, failings and imperfections, but fairly state the case and matter as he can to convey his ideas.
- No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one subject without liberty obtained from the Association.
- 7. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without liberty obtained from it.
- 8. No member of the Association shall have liberty of laughing during the sitting of the Association, nor whispering in time of public speech.
- 9. No member of the Association shall address another in any other term or appellation but the title of "Brother."
- 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member in a speech or prohibit him from speaking until he give his light on the subject, except they break the Rules of Decorum.

- 11. Names of several members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk and called over as many times as the Association may require.
- 12. The Moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as another member, provided the chair be filled, and he shall have no vote except the Association be equally divided. In that event he shall give the casting vote.
- 13. Any member who shall willfully or knowingly break any of these rules shall be reproved by the Association as they think proper.


